MINUTES OF May 20, 2022 BOARD MEETING CENTRAL TEXAS GROUNDWATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT

The Board of Directors of the Central Texas Groundwater Conservation District held a Regular Board Meeting on Friday, May 20, 2022 at 9:00 a.m. in the District office located at 225 S. Pierce Street, Suite 104, Burnet, Texas.

President Rowney declared a quorum present and called the Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

President Rowney then called for the Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance to the Flags.

President Rowney then asked for public comment. There was no public comment.

President Rowney announced that agenda item 4 Consideration and/or action relating to Cause No. 53288, Central Texas GCD v. Deer Springs and Cody Lewis, Burnet County District Court, would be moved to the end of the agenda.

President Rowney then asked for consideration and/or action on Interlocal Agreement with Burnet County for Groundwater Supply Resilience Study in Coordination with the District and INTERA. General Manager Sodek informed the Board that INTERA had, at the request of the District, presented a proposal to the Burney County Commissioners Court requesting funds of just under \$100,000.00 from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 to develop a conceptual model of the hydrogeology in Burnet County to help with understanding groundwater availability. The Court approved an interlocal agreement drafted by Bill Dugat, District Legal Counsel. The District will provide data and in-kind services to the project through an inter-local agreement and received the project deliverables.

Approve the Interlocal Agreement with Burnet County for Groundwater Supply Resilience Study in Coordination with the District and INTERA.

Vote on the motion carried.

President Rowney then asked for consideration and/or action on Texas 4-H Water Ambassadors Program. General Manager Sodek informed the Board that the District has been a signature sponsor of the program since its inception and suggested that they continue to be a sponsor.

General Manager Sodek reported that the latest Palmer Hydrological Drought Index continues to show severe drought with a seasonal outlook of the drought to continue to worsen. No recommended changes to stage 3-severe drought. Paul King asked for the next drought update to include graphs of various District Monitor Wells. No action was taken.

President Rowney then called on the General Manager for the General Manager and/or Staff Report and Update.

- a. Well Registrations & Permitting
 General Manager Sodek reviewed graphs of current figures for well registration and permitting.
 The District is still receiving an average of 50 well registration applications per month.
